

- Trail Construction Led by Jenny Blackmore (17 outings)
 - Oct 7, 14, 21, 28 Worked on and completed the Challenge Trail Extension from across the Crest Hwy from Dry Camp (Tecolote Trailhead) northwest to the downhill ski area
 - Nov 4, 11, 18, Dec 2, 9, 16; Eric Russell led Dec 23 Worked on an extension to Wagon Trail which will connect this trail to the Sulphur Canyon PA
 - Jan 13 & 27, Mar 3, 10, 17, 24, 31 (conditions unfavorable throughout Feb) Built or rerouted several trails in the **Placitas Trail System** as part of a larger project, per Kerry Wood, of closing off multiple undesignated social trails there and expanding the designated trail system

 - 10/7/21 Log limbing and bucking at Capulin and Nine–Mile PAs. Cut brush at Capulin PA
 - 10/12/21 Graffiti removal at Juan Tabo PA
 - 10/13/21 Splitting and hauling 3 cords of donation wood at Capulin and Nine–Mile PAs.
 - 10/16/21 Cut stumps on Sandia Nordic Ski Club trails
