
Great American Outdoors Act

- Construction this summer TBD







PICNIC IN JUAN TABO BASIN

HISTORIC LA CUEVA & JUAN TABO PICNIC GROUNDS

Here in the Juan Tabo Basin, enjoy two unique historic pionic areas: La Cueve Pionic Ground and Juan Tabo Pionic Ground. Built from 1934-1935 by the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC), these areas provide much to explore. Pionic tables of various shapes and sizes sit nestled in the shade of gray oak stands, tucked beside massive grante boulders, or set on ridges with sweeping views of the Albuquerque Valley below. Make sure to visit the ioonic rock shelters at each pionic ground to experience the unique 'Rustic Style' architecture of this period, and to gain commanding views of the surrounding landscape.
