total hand built trail 3.41 miles = 18,005 ft

 $$90.300 \div 18.005 \text{ ft} = 5.02 per foot

NOTE: professional trail builders charge \$7.00 per foot using machinery

Summary

It took over 2 years with 105 volunteers from multiple organizations. They worked a total of 50 days for a total of 3,010 volunteer hours. FOSM built the majority of the trail with 44 workdays and AMBA contributed 6 days. The Talking Talons Youth Conservation Corps participated in 3 total workdays alongside FOSM in 2021 and 2023.

The USFS spent an incredible amount of time and energy in planning, designing, flagging and supervising.

The trail is approximately 4.36 miles from the Sandia Ski Base to Bill Spring Trail. It is remarkable for its beauty and astounding views. Measuring between 2 and 3 feet in width, it follows the rigorous standards of the US Forest Service for environmental protection, wildlife protection, sustainability and user experience. Multiple user groups will enjoy the new trail, including hikers, runners, mountain bikers, horse riders, and cross country skiers. One may also encounter deer, turkeys and other wildlife. Most of the trail is in deep wooded areas passing through a large ponderosa meadow, coursing in and out of small valleys. A portion includes the historic abandoned unpaved Crest road built in the 1930's.
