## Bylaws & Policies Revision

- At the February board meeting an update to the FOSM Bylaws & Policies was decided:
  - Polices had been updated as needed, but not recently (last on Sept. 11, 2019)
  - Bylaws have not been changed since the original incorporation of the NM Friends of the Forest
- A core team reviewed bylaws from several other non-profits, incl. NMVFO and the Las Placitas Association, and revised the FOSM bylaws
  - Core team: Silke Bletzer, Mike Madden, Cliff Giles, Dan Benton
- The policies were streamlined and reworded where needed
  - Input and review provided by: Silke, Mike, Cliff, Sally Lowder, Lou Romero, Joe Meade
  - New policies were added for FOSM sawyer requirements, FOSM documentation, and the SAM Beard award



# Bylaws & Policies Revision

- At the August board meeting, the revised bylaws and policies were approved by the board
- Per FOSM bylaws, Mike Madden distributed the new draft (and policies) to the full membership for review August 9<sup>th</sup>, 2025, with comments due to Silke by Sept. 9<sup>th</sup>
  - No comments were received
  - A majority of the members present at the October 7<sup>th</sup> annual membership meeting is required for final approval of the new bylaws

# Sam Beard Achievement Award

- Annually, starting in 2025, this award is given to members of the Friends of the Sandia Mountains (FOSM) in recognition of exceptional volunteer service to the Forest Service and our public lands.
- The award is named for Sam Beard who epitomizes the basis of the award.
- Sam cofounded FOSM in 1997 and still spends most days every week in dedicated service to its mission at an age when most have passed or retired to a comfortable chair.

2025 Sam Beard Achievement Award Winner Nominations were solicited from the board and weekly crew leaders.
The board chose **Don Carnicom** to

receive the 2025 award.

 Don was a cofounder of FOSM and has supported our organization for 28 years.

- A meeting of the new Board will follow soon.







### Program Introduction, Cliff Giles, Vice-President

- EarthCaches (ECs) are a special category of geocache sponsored by the Geological Society of America.
  - Almost 30,000 ECs worldwide
  - New Mexico home to over 100, Sandias home to 17, with 12 of those being new ones the author recently "published".
- Teach an Earth Science lesson, include tasks that reinforce that lesson, and are based on the world around us not on informational signs.
- Talk will be a guided tour through geologic time, from the Proterozoic to the Holocene, highlighting some of the less well-known, but still fascinating, geology as represented by the new ECs.
- ECs are entirely virtual, meaning they are not associated with any physical cache container in the field. "Treasure" is the geology, and the geology is the fun!



### Speaker Introduction, Cliff Giles, Vice-President

- Stan Davis
  - Retired after 35 years as a geophysicist in the oil industry
  - Moved to Albuquerque in 2019, lured in part by easy access to the outdoors and abundant trails close by in the Sandias and elsewhere in New Mexico
  - Enjoys hiking the variety of trails (and "off-trails") here and investigating the local geology
  - Hiked more than 2,500 miles in the Sandia mountains and foothills since moving here
  - Is a volunteer for his neighborhood association and writes articles about the Sandias for the association's newsletter
  - Became a hike leader for the New Mexico Mountain Club in 2025 and has led geologythemed hikes in the Sandias with the club
  - Member of the Pastel Society of New Mexico and enjoys painting landscapes and subjects from the Sandias
